### Reproduction :

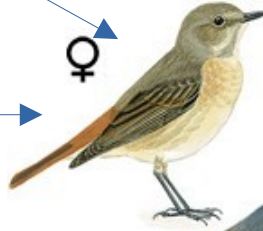
The Wall Nightingale is cavernous

It is a forest species. It prefers leafy forests but can also be found in bushes and hedges in the middle of meadows and crops.

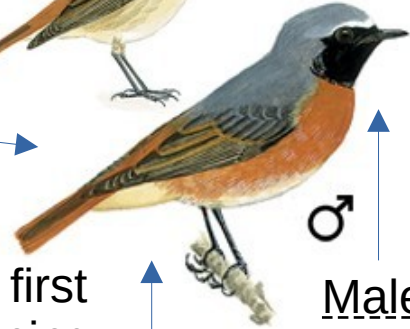

### Power supply :

It is an insectivore, feeding on young insects and their larvae, or various other invertebrates, spiders, molluscs, crustaceans. Finally, from summer to autumn, it turns to small fruits.

### Behaviour :

He is shy and discreet.  
It easily occupies nesting boxes.  
Migratory movements are nocturnal, the first migrants are back in spring, at the beginning of April in the south or in the north

### Threatened ?

No, but the species has nevertheless undergone a marked decline in the second half of the 20th century (drought in the Sahel, overly restrictive forestry management, etc.)
