Description

The house sparrow is a fairly stocky bird, it measures about 16cm and weighs between 24 and 39g, it comes from the family of the passeridae and has an average life of 3 years. Females and young birds are brown and grey while males are black, white and brown.

His reproduction

The house sparrow usually reproduces from April to August, it lays 2-5 eggs in a small cup of grass and twigs that constitute the nest of the sparrow, the place where the nests are found are very diverse, they can be in a tree or in the cavity of a wall
Incubation time is very short
(11-14 days)

It's habitat

Domestic sparrows are sedentary animals, they live all year long in the same place, being very attached to humans, they are most often found in urban environments. They nest in various building cavities, in swallow nests or in a tree hole.

His behaviour

The house sparrow moves in groups, it never stays alone. It is a very sociable and noisy bird. It is also very attached to man.

It's diet

The House Sparrow mainly feeds on seeds all year round but it can also feed on berries and buds, it diversifies feeding during the summer to look for some small insects.
